

RESOLUTION NO. 9-2022

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NEW PHILADELPHIA TO APPLY FOR THE OHIO MID-EASTERN GOVERNMENTS ASSOCIATION (OMEGA) REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION (RTPO) CAPITAL ALLOCATION PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, House Bill 74 of the 134th Ohio General Assembly created the Regional Transportation Planning Grant Program;

WHEREAS, OMEGA will receive an allocation of Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funding for state fiscal years 2022 and 2023 for this program;

WHEREAS, Local Public Agencies (LPA) are eligible to apply to OMEGA for funding through OMEGA RTPO Capital Allocation Program;

WHEREAS, the CITY OF NEW PHILADELPHIA BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN CONNECTIVITY PROJECT, PHASE I, hereinafter referred to as the Project, is a transportation activity eligible to receive this federal funding;

WHEREAS, the LPA is requesting a grant from the OMEGA RTPO Capital Allocation Program in the amount of \$250,000.00 for said Project;

WHEREAS, the LPA has matching funds in the amount of \$1,886,900.00 from other grants, loans, and/or local funds for said project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by THE NEW PHILADELPHIA CITY COUNCIL, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The MAYOR of the CITY OF NEW PHILADELPHIA is hereby authorized to apply to the OMEGA RTPO Capital Allocation Program for funds as described above.

SECTION 2: The MAYOR of the CITY OF NEW PHILADELPHIA is authorized to enter into any agreements as may be necessary and appropriate for obtaining this financial assistance.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, and its immediate passage is necessary in order to preserve, protect, and maintain the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of New Philadelphia, Ohio.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval.
