She asked what would be the additional cost of having an ambulance and fire truck at the mall. She said she was upset to hear that Adelphia Cable won't be family oriented any longer. Mayor Brodzinski said the Airport Restaurant Manager did not present a statement of income for the previous month because she did not attend the last Airport Commission meeting; however, the restaurant will no longer serve breakfast as a way to cut costs. He said costs of safety services at the mall could mount up to be quite high.
