#### **VISITOR'S COMMENTS:**

Dave Shroyer, 407 Ray Ave. N.E., New Philadelphia, said storm sewers are being installed on Ray Ave. currently, but asked why new sidewalks or driveway approaches are not included in the project. He said the north side is getting the sidewalks and curbs, but the south side is not. He compared the project to others within the city for which these were included. Mayor Brodzinski said this is a CDBG project, and is done according to the funds that are available, and are only available to moderate and low income areas. He added that the north side of Ray Ave. qualifies for low and moderate income, but the south side does not. Mayor Brodzinski said that funds are available from the Sidewalk Replacement Fund for those residents who are willing to pay ½ the cost, with the city paying the other ½.

Charles Bowersock, 413 Ray Ave. N.E., New Philadelphia, said the sidewalks there have been ruined by flooding, and should be the city's responsibility, and he doesn't think he should have to pay ½ the cost.

Ed Demattio, 433 Ray Avenue, N.E., New Philadelphia, said the water was high in the street after a storm the night before, and is concerned that future flooding will happen.

Robert Snider, 309 Ray Ave., N.E., New Philadelphia, said excess water accumulates in his driveway because the street is higher than the driveway. He asked that something be done to alleviate this.

Megan Linard, 910 West High Ave., New Philadelphia, presented pictures of the deplorable condition of her neighbor's property. She asked that the neighbor be required to install a fence around his property. Mayor Brodzinski will look into this.
